Enable Lesson 1 – Assurance of Salvation

Objective:

To be able to provide every person a greater understanding of the importance of being assured of their salvation after making a personal commitment to accept Jesus Christ as Lord and personal Savior.

I. God's Original Plan for Man

God's original plan for man is to spend eternity with Him in heaven. God gave man the freedom to choose, the will... to choose or reject the salvation offered by Christ and whatever choice we make, there is a consequence. Eventually, man chose to disobey God and the Bible calls that disobedience ____.

Romans 3:23 "for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God."

II. The Fall of Man

All the way back in Genesis, Adam and Eve were created by God to live in the Garden of Eden where God provided for all their needs. God gave them one specific commandment: do not eat from the tree in the middle of the garden. One day, Satan (in the form of a serpent) tempted Eve and convinced her to eat the fruit from the tree. Then Eve gave some of the fruit to Adam and he also ate it. At that very moment, they both realized they have sinned and disobeyed God. Because of their sin, God banished Adam and Eve from the garden. That sin ended their intimate relationship with God— equal to _____ death. Therefore, the curse of death came into the world because of their sin.

Romans 6:23 "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Man's sin resulted in _____ from God (Isaiah 59:2), _____ death (Hebrew 9:27a) and _____ in hell (Matthew 25:41-46).

Discussion question: When you were young, have you ever been caught in an act of disobedience? What punishment did you receive? Were you forgiven? How did that feel?

III. How Can We Be Saved?

There is the GOOD NEWS! God so loved us that He provided a way for us to have eternal life with Him by _____ His Son Jesus Christ. (John 3:16, Romans 5:8). Two things for us to do: First, by _____ from our sins (180-degree turn). Repentance means asking God for forgiveness of our sins and deciding to turn away from a sinful life to a life of _____ to God. When we repent of our sins we receive God's forgiveness. (Acts 2:38)



Second, by making Jesus our _____ & _____ through personal confession. This means we give Jesus full control over all areas of our lives and living a surrendered life to Jesus. (Romans 10:9-10, Romans 10:13). This is spiritual rebirth or being born _____. It means becoming part of God's family—the word "again" literally means "from above"—becoming a child of God. It is being alive _____ with the life Jesus gave us. (John 3:3-5, 2 Corinthians 5:17)

Summary:

God provided a way for us to have eternal life with Him by sending His Son Jesus Christ so that _____ places their faith in Him will be saved. (John 3:16) Jesus died to pay for our sins and rescued/saved us from eternal _____. Salvation is available to anyone who will trust in Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior.

Conclusion & Application:

The Bible (God's Word), gives us the assurance that the moment we put our full trust in Christ, receive Him as Lord and Savior, we have the assurance of eternal life. The Inner Witness (strong knowing in our hearts) of the Holy Spirit gives us this assurance through the peace in our hearts. (Romans 8:16, John 1:12)

We can never be saved by trying to be a good person, nor can we be saved through doing good works, being kind to the poor, being religious, etc. (Ephesians 2:8-10). Salvation only happens by placing our faith in Jesus and what He has done on the cross.

THE LORD'S PRAYER (Matthew 6:7-13) NKJV

Our Father in Heaven - *We can have the boldness to approach God as our Heavenly Father.*

Hallowed Be Your Name - *We start by honoring His Name, praising and worshipping Him for who He is and what He has done.*

Your Kingdom Come, Your Will Be Done on Earth as It Is in Heaven - *We pray for His rule and reign to come in our lives, both in the present and in the future. We pray for people to know Christ and make Him Lord and Savior. We pray for people to be healed and be set free from the lies of the devil. We can pray for our family, friends, classmates, workmates, people in our government, etc.*

Give Us This Day Our Daily Bread - *We ask God to meet and supply all our _____ (Matthew 7:7, Philippians 4:19)*

Forgive Us Our Sins As We Forgive Those Who Sin Against Us - *We ask God to forgive our sins (John 1:9), and to forgive those who have sinned against us, whether they have apologized or not, we are to release them to God and forgive them. **Unforgiveness is a sin** and if we have sin in our hearts, the Lord will not listen to our prayers.*



And Lead Us Not into Temptation But Deliver Us From Evil - *Ask God for grace and strength against the attacks of the Devil.*

For Yours Is the Kingdom And The Power And The Glory Forever - *and give God the glory again before ending in prayer.*

AMEN. - *End in agreement with God's Word and promises knowing by faith that our prayers are heard and answered by God.*

I. What Is Water Baptism?

Water baptism is a public _____ of an inward commitment to our Lord Jesus Christ. It is a means of _____ ourselves with the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus (Romans 6:3-5). It is a special celebration of being a part of God's family. This is NOT done to wash away our sins because our sins are already washed by the _____ that Jesus Christ shed when He died on the cross.

Is it necessary to be baptized in water?

Yes, because it is Jesus' _____ (Matthew 28:19; Mark 16:15-16). Even Jesus Himself, was baptized by John in the Jordan River because He had to obey the Father and be an example to the believers (Matthew 3:13-17).

II. How Is Water Baptism Done?

The word *baptizo* came from the Greek word meaning "to _____" and this is the biblical way of being baptized in water. Any believer in Christ who lives in _____ to His will may be baptized (Acts 2:38, 41; Acts 8:36-39).

III. When Should You Be Baptized in Water?

As _____ as you get born again. The true mark of a believer is _____.

IV. Why Do We Not Baptize Babies?

Babies do not have the **capacity** to decide that is why Peter preached about being baptized in water after _____ from sin. (Acts 2:38). Babies are instead _____ to the Lord, which means parents are committing the life of the baby to God's plan and purpose. The Bible also does not _____ of any baby who was baptized in water. Jesus Himself was _____ to God when He was a baby (Luke 2:22). He was only water baptized at the age of thirty (Matthew 3: 13-17). If you happen to have been baptized in water as an infant, you still need to undergo water baptism now that you know its true biblical meaning.



Summary:

Being born again and publicly declaring Jesus as Lord and Savior is a decision a person makes, that is why the Bible doesn't teach infant baptism.

Conclusion & Application:

Any believer in Christ who lives in obedience to His will may be baptized. But preferably, it should be officiated by a minister, elder or even your life group leader. I. What is the Baptism in the Holy Spirit?

Before Jesus went to heaven, He gave His disciples His final instructions. He told them that they will be His witnesses throughout the world. But before this happens, He emphasized that they needed to receive the gift of the Holy Spirit referred to as “the promise of the Father” (Acts 1:4 NIV). He assured them that the promised Spirit would be their source of power to accomplish their divine mission (Acts 1:8 NIV) and therefore, available to those who are believers in Jesus Christ. (Luke 24:49; Acts 1:4-5). The word baptism came from the Greek word “Baptizo” which means immersion, submersion.” Therefore, to be baptised in the Holy Spirit means to be immersed in the power of the Holy Spirit.

II. What Is the Purpose of Baptism in the Holy Spirit?

The Baptism in the Holy Spirit is an experience in which the believer yields control of Himself to the Holy Spirit. (Matthew 3:11, Acts 1:5, Eph. 5: 18). Through this he/she comes to know Christ in a more _____ way (John 16: 13-15) and receives _____ to witness and grow _____. (2 Cor.3:18, Acts 1:8).

Believers should earnestly seek this experience according to the _____ of our Lord Jesus Christ (Acts 1: 4-5, 8). The baptism in the Holy Spirit is the beginning of a Spirit-filled life. As a result of this spiritual experience, the Holy Spirit can help us live empowered Christian lives, overcome sin and help us grow in spiritual maturity (Luke 24:49).

Who is the Baptizer in the Holy Spirit?

John the Baptist introduced Jesus as the baptizer in the Holy Spirit (Matthew 3:11, Luke 3:16). Jesus is the same yesterday, today and forever and He still baptizes people today. The prophet Joel said that in the last days, God will pour out His Spirit on everyone (Acts 2:16-18).

III. How Can We Be Baptized in The Holy Spirit?

There are a number of ways which we can be baptized in the Holy Spirit.



1. We can ask for it by _____ for the purpose of obeying God (Luke 11:13).
2. While in our personal time of _____ (Acts 1:14; 2:1).
3. While listening to the preaching of God's _____ (Acts 10:44-46).
4. Through the _____ on of hands by Spirit-filled believers (Acts 19:1-6).

IV. What is Speaking in Tongues?

The _____ evidence of the baptism in the Holy Spirit is speaking in tongues as the Spirit gives utterance or words (Acts 2: 1-4, 9-17, 39; 1 Cor. 14:18). This experience is distinct (separate) from and subsequent (follows after) the experience of the new birth/salvation (Acts 8:12-17; 10:44-46).

Two Kinds of Tongues:

A. _____ tongue- known language (like English, French or Spanish) but unknown to the one speaking; ex. A Filipino who does not know how to speak French suddenly speaks French as the Holy Spirit enables him. This is what the apostles experienced on the Day of Pentecost when they were heard speaking the different languages of the people who came to celebrate the Feast of Passover with them. The apostles were Galileans, but the Holy Spirit enabled them to speak in different tongues (Acts 2:5-11).

B. _____ tongue- language not known by anyone in the world. It's called the language of the Holy Spirit (1 Corinthians 14:2-4 KJV).

Summary:

Why Should Every Believer in Christ Speak in (Unknown) Tongues?

Speaking in tongues results in greater intimacy with God (1 Corinthians 14:2, 14), it builds up our faith (Jude 1:20) and other fellow believers (if there is interpretation) (1 Cor. 14:4, 26, 27). The Holy Spirit also helps us in praying for the perfect will of God concerning situations that we go through (Romans 8:26-27).

Conclusion & Application:

Believers should We Speak in Tongues in both _____ place (by ourselves) where we can speak or pray aloud or in a _____ place with other believers, we should do it quietly or share it with others if there is an interpreter (1 Corinthians 14:27-28)

Fellowship is the Greek word “KOINONIA.” God wants us to experience _____ together. The Bible calls this *fellowship*. It’s not about people having casual conversation, socializing, eating or sharing food together or just having fun. It’s about promoting genuine care and concern as brothers and sisters in Jesus Christ.

Principles of Tithing:

The _____ in the Bible to give our tithes and offerings to the Lord have corresponding promises of prosperity. Proverbs 3:9-10, Malachi 3:10-12, Philippians 4:15-19, 2 Corinthians 9:6-8

1. We give from the _____. (Proverbs 3:9; Luke 20:20-25). The Bible commands us to give from the gross of our income and all our increase. We pay taxes from the gross, we also are to give our tithes from the gross.
2. We give it ____ before other expenses or put it first in our budget (Exodus 22:29-30; Proverbs 3:9). God is to be the Lord of all and first in our _____.
3. We give it to our _____ church (Malachi 3:10) to pay for the operating expenses of the church to fulfill God's unique vision for the local church where we belong. After we have tithed that we can give offerings as we are moved to help and support other needs of our own church as well as the needs of other churches and ministries.
4. We give our tithes as an act of _____ to God (Proverbs 3:9) Acknowledge that God is the source of all the things that we have (Deut:8:18).
