Venue: Home gatherings

Sing one or two songs or play a song from You Tube. **Venue: Public place** (school, café, park, etc.) or **Via Online**, Testimonies: "What is your "high" or "your "low" this past week?" Opening Prayer: Pray for the Holy Spirit to reveal to us how to know Christ in a deeper way.

WELCOME (15 MINS)

Welcome guests/first-time visitors.

Memory Verse: Romans 10:15 NIV

Ice-breaker: Q1 :Why don't feet ever get into arguments? Ans. Because they always put their best foot forward!

Q2:What did one shoe say to the other? Ans. "I'm so glad we're a perfect match!"

WORD(30-45 MINS) Text: ROMANS 10:13-15 NIV

Intro: Today, I want us to talk about a unique and powerful symbol in the Bible—having "**beautiful feet**." But don't worry, this isn't about getting a pedicure or a spa treatment! Instead, we're going to explore what truly makes our feet beautiful in God's eyes.

Let's dive into Scripture and discover what the Bible says about having beautiful feet and why it matters in our walk of faith. It is interesting that the Bible talks about the feet! Our God even calls the "feet" beautiful. Why the feet? It's because it is with one's feet that they carry the Gospel of Jesus Christ to lost sinners.

1. Be a messenger of good news -

The phrase "beautiful feet" refers to those who bring good news, like a messenger running to announce victory to a kingdom at war. In God's eyes, the beauty isn't in the physical appearance of the feet but in their role—proclaiming His reign, peace, and salvation. Those who share the Gospel bring hope, comfort, and salvation to others, making their feet truly beautiful as they carry the life-giving message of reconciliation with God.

Q: It's important to have "beautiful feet" in God's eyes, how can you live that out in your daily life at work or at school?

Q: When was the last time you shared the message of Jesus with someone (a friend, co-worker, relative, family member)? How did it feel to bring hope and encouragement to them? Q: What are some practical ways you can be a messenger of God's peace and salvation to your friends and community?

2. Be ready to go when God tells us to go

Having "Beautiful feet" symbolizes obedience and dedication to God's mission. Those with beautiful feet are always ready to do His will, actively serving by spreading His message. It reflects a heart fully devoted to God, willing to go wherever He leads and face the challenges of sharing His love and truth.

Q: What does being "ready to do God's will" look like in your daily life?

Q: What challenges might stop you from sharing God's love and truth, and how can you overcome them?

Q: How can you actively serve God and be His messenger in your school, home, workplace or community?

Leader's Tips:

S - Sensitivity. No one should feel left out.

P - Participation is encouraged.

A - Acknowledge. Make guests feel welcomed.
C - Confidentiality.What is shared stays in the group.

E - Encouragement. Be a blessing to one another.

3. Be pleasing to God -

"Beautiful feet" represent actions that align with God's purpose, especially in fulfilling the Great Commission (Read Matthew 28:19-20). Sharing the Gospel brings joy and divine approval, as believers take part in God's redemptive work. True worship and following Christ involve living a life that pleases God, and nothing delights Him more than seeing His saved children share the same Gospel message that transformed their lives to other people.

Q: Why do you think sharing the Gospel is important to God, and how can you be part of His mission?

Q: What fears or challenges do you have about telling others about Jesus, and how can you overcome them?

Q: How can we live in a way that pleases God and reflects His love to those around us?

Conclusion:

If we are not ashamed (Romans 1:16) of Jesus or His gospel, He will proudly present us in heaven to His Father. Our decision to have beautiful feet or not has eternal consequences. Read Matthew 10:32-33 NKJV

The following are very important questions for each of us to answer today:

1. What kind of feet do we have? Do we want to have beautiful feet in God's eyes?

2. How can we use our talents and interests to share God's love with others in your daily life?

3. Who in your life might need to hear the "good news," and how can you share it with them in a way that feels natural and loving?

What is your take-away from this lesson?
