

Where Are You Going?

WORSHIP (15 MINS)

Venue: Home gatherings

Sing one or two songs or play a song from You Tube.

Venue: Public place (school, café, park, etc.) or **Via Online,**

Testimonies: “What is your “high” or “your “low” this past week?”

Ask someone to do the opening prayer.

WELCOME (15 MINS)

Welcome guests/first-time visitors.

WORD(30-45 MINS)

Intro: As a church family, we will embark on a journey of grace and discover how deeply God loves us—and how deeply He desires all people to encounter Him. On this journey, we will be equipped and motivated to join Jesus in His mission of loving and reaching people who do not know Him as Lord and Savior.

What is your understanding of “Evangelism?”

It is the act of sharing or spreading the message of the Gospel—the good news about Jesus Christ, His death, burial and resurrection—with the intention of helping others come to faith in Him and enjoy His salvation from sin. It’s a central practice in Christianity, rooted in Jesus’ command to “go and make disciples of all nations”

I. Imagine the New City - Read Revelation 21:1-5

The Apostle John sees a vision of a new heaven and a new earth, for the old ones have passed away. The Holy City, the New Jerusalem, comes down from heaven, beautifully prepared like a bride. God Himself declares that He will dwell with His people—there will be no more death, sorrow, crying, or pain. All things will be made new, and God's words are trustworthy and true.

Q: What is your idea of a perfect city?

Q: If you could live in a place with no pain, no evil, and no sorrow, how would that change your outlook on life today?

Q: If you could walk in the happiest place ever — full of love and no stress — who’s one person you’d want to see or meet there? Why? (Ex. a Bible hero, or even someone you’ve missed.)

Q: How does it feel to be in a place with no more tears, no more death or sorrow or crying or pain and all these negative things are gone forever?

II. The Glory of Jesus Revealed - Read Revelation 5:9-13

A new song of worship breaks out in heaven, declaring Jesus (the Lamb) as worthy because He was slain and by His blood, He redeemed people from every tribe, language, and nation. Countless angels, living creatures, and elders join in proclaiming the Lamb is worthy to receive all power, riches, wisdom, strength, honor, glory, and blessing. Jesus is worshipped by all creation as the slain and risen Lamb. Every voice, every nation, every tribe praising Him together.

Q: Who in my life needs to hear that they can be included in Jesus’ invitation—from every tribe, language, people, and nation?

Q: Does my daily life—my time, choices, priorities—show that I believe He is worthy? Is my worship of Jesus confined to Sunday, or does it echo in how I live every day?

Q: How can my life reflect God's kingdom mission across every tribe, language, and nation?

III. Conclusion *How did you come to be a follower of Christ? What if someone had not shared Jesus with you at that moment? What kind of life would you be living today? Today, God is giving us opportunities to share Jesus with our co-workers, our classmates, and our friends, but the sad thing is we don't see ourselves at our places of work as missionaries to share Jesus. God used somebody to lead you to Christ. Who is that somebody you can lead to Christ? They are all around us—in our homes, our neighborhoods, our workplaces, our schools, etc. May we be a people so hope-filled about our future, people lit up with love, empowered to love those who need Jesus!*

Read I John 5:11-13, “and this is the testimony God has given us eternal life and this life is in his son the one who has the son has life the one who does not have the Son of God does not have life. I've written these things to you who believe in the name of the son of God so that you may know that you have eternal life.”

IV. Reflection

Knowing we'll be with God forever one day, how should that change how we treat our friends, family, or even people we struggle to get along with? (Does it help you be more patient, kind, forgiving?)

WORK(15 MINS)

Application

Practical steps to to becoming a Good News person:

1. Pray – pray for people who do not know Jesus to come into your life.

2. Care – when they come into your life, care for them, by listening to their story,

3. Share – so you will know how to apply the gospel, share your faith with them.

Things to do:

How can our lives reflect the Good News. Write down two-three (2-3) steps you can take this week to help someone else experience God's love.

Example: Pray and prepare a Hit List (maximum of 5-10 names of family, friends, schoolmates, workmates, neighbors, etc.) of possible people you desire to encounter Christ in 2025.
