

What Happens When We are Lit Up with Love?

WORSHIP (15 MINS)

Venue: Home gatherings

Sing one or two songs or play a song from You Tube.

Venue: Public place (school, café, park, etc.) or **Via Online,**

Testimonies: "What is your "high" or "low" this past week?"

Ask someone to do the opening prayer.

WELCOME (15 MINS)

Welcome guests/first-time visitors.

WORD(30-45 MINS)

Intro: Our series is titled "Lit Up with Love: Becoming Good News People to a Gospel-Starved World." Let's pause and reflect for a moment— we live in a world that's starving. We all have a tendency to look or turn for things around us that we think can satisfy us, thinking it will give full sense of fulfillment but eventually a false sense of hope.

What does it mean to become Good News people?

It means this: God saw our deep spiritual hunger and responded by sending Jesus, the Bread of Life. Only He can truly satisfy the emptiness in our souls. Through His life, death, resurrection, and the Holy Spirit, Jesus now lives in us. As His followers, we are called to be living advertisements—visible signs of hope and fullness to a world desperate for something real.

Q: How do we "promote" Jesus to people around us (ex.family, friends, workmates, schoolmates, etc.) who do not know Jesus as Lord and Savior?

Q: Have we considered ourselves being an everyday missionaries, joining Jesus in His mission to seek and save the lost?

"For the Son of Man (Jesus) came to seek and save those who are lost."

Luke 19:10 NLT

What does it mean to be lit up with love?

I. It means that Jesus is the supreme love of your life.

Read Colossians 1:13-14 CSB

Q: Have you been in a situation where you have to be rescued or saved?

Q: How important is it for a person to experience being rescued?

Read 2 Corinthians 5:14-15 "14

Q: Have you ever been in a situation where you were compelled to do something out of the ordinary?

Q: When was the last time you felt "compelled by the love of Christ to share His love with others?

II. It means the love of Jesus grows deep in us and we taste his goodness, we hunger to share his redeeming love with lost people –

The more we fall in love with Jesus, the more beautiful He becomes the more you want others to get to know Him. We know God can meet our deepest needs, forgives our worst sins, and turns our failures into triumphs.

Q: What hinders most Christians to tell people about Christ?

Maybe we don't know where to start the conversation. Or perhaps we don't want to come across as arrogant (even though, ironically, has never been louder about sharing what they believe). This I know: **The more we are lit up with love, the more we will share Christ. Those of us who know His love will not be able to contain it. We will burn brightly and catch others on fire.**

Q: When was the last time you had the boldness to share Jesus to a friend?

Q: What was his/her reaction to you when you shared the gospel to him/her?

III. It means we should embrace evangelism as a process, not as a one time event. Read John 4:35-38 NLT

We have the freedom to share the gospel, but only God can convict hearts and draw people to faith; evangelism is a process where different people play different roles— some prepare hearts, some plant seeds, some nurture growth, and others help reap the harvest—but each part is vital, and every step is true evangelism.

Q: Is there someone you want to lead to Christ but it's taking the person a long time to believe?

IV. It means evangelism and discipleship must be integrated

Jesus didn't call us to make converts, but disciples— people who follow Christ wholeheartedly, learn from Him, and live as citizens of His Kingdom through His power. As Christ-followers, we're meant to reflect His life and walk alongside others, helping them grow and live by the Holy Spirit, not just leading them to a one-time decision.

Conclusion: Evangelism is a journey, not a sprint. When we're filled with Christ's love, we see that coming to faith takes time. Jesus is our greatest treasure, and sharing Him is always worth it. So let's trust the process, stay faithful, and help others come to know and enjoy Him for eternity.

WORK(15 MINS)

Application

Practical steps to to becoming a Good News person:

1. Pray – pray for people who do not know Jesus to come into your life.

2. Care – when they come into your life, care for them, by listening to their story,

3. Share – so you will know how to apply the gospel, share your faith with them.

Things to do:

How can our lives reflect the Good News. Write down two-three (2-3) steps you can take this week to help someone else experience God's love.

Example: Pray and prepare a Hit List (max. of 5-10 names of family, relatives, friends, schoolmates, workmates, neighbors, etc.) of possible people you desire to encounter Christ in 2025.
